

Book Club Discussion Questions for *Complicit*

1. *Complicit* is set in a small town in the Southern New Mexican desert. How did the setting and atmosphere of the book affect the mood and tone of the story? Did it create a sense of danger, mystery, dread or unease?
2. What did you think of the main character, Kate Medina? Did she make any decisions that you didn't agree with in response to the conflict of the novel?
3. Generational trauma and family relationships are central themes in *Complicit*. How did the complicated relationship between Kate and her sister Tilly impact the story?
4. Most crime stories have a villain. Who is the villain in *Complicit*? Did you understand their motives? Did they have any redeeming qualities or human emotions?
5. Which character did you relate to or empathize with the most and why?
6. Are there any characters you wish you could have given advice to? What would you tell them?
7. How did the author explore themes such as justice, truth, deception, or morality?
8. What was the most memorable or shocking scene in the story and why?
9. What was the most satisfying or disappointing part of the story and why?
10. *Complicit* is the first book in a series. Were you satisfied with the resolution in this part of the story, knowing that there is more to come? Did it make sense and tie up enough loose ends to make you read more?
11. What do you think happens to the characters after the story ends?
12. Did *Complicit* change your understanding of domestic human trafficking in any way?
